What is the Seattle Preschool Program?

- The Seattle Preschool Program (SPP) offers high-quality, affordable preschool to children across the City of Seattle.
- Our goal is to: prepare children for school, enable students to achieve preacademic skills, enable students to develop socially and emotionally and eliminate the readiness gap for participating children. SPP is supported by funding from the voter-approved Families, Education, Preschool and Promise Levy (FEPP).
- City wide, the SPP network currently has 83 locations with the majority in the south and central regions of Seattle.





SPP Highlights

- SPP partners with Providers such as Seattle Public Schools, and community-based providers such as YMCA, Launch, and ReWA. Our network also includes Family Child Care centers for parents who prefer a home-based option.
- Some locations offer dual language programming (Spanish, Chinese, Arabic, and Vietnamese)
- Some of our Providers also serve ECEAP and Head Start and their classrooms are blended with SPP.
- SPP typically runs 6 hours a day, M-F, and flexible schedules such as 3 days a week, are not an option.
- Extended day is offered at many locations for parents who need care beyond the 6hour preschool portion of the day (Child Care subsidy is accepted by the Provider as payment for this extra care.)
- SPP does not offer transportation. It is the parent/guardian responsibility to bring the child to school and pick up on time.
- Staff do not ask about immigration status.

Eligibility Criteria

Age: Serves children ages 3 or 4 on or by August 31, of the program year. For example, if a parent is looking to apply for the upcoming 2021-2022 school year, their child must be age 3 or 4 by 8/31/2021. (Unfortunately, at this time, there is no flexibility around the eligibility age cut off date.)

Residency: Open to all Seattle residents *only*. Unfortunately, those living in unincorporated Seattle, are not eligible. To confirm if an address is in true Seattle limits, the City has an address look up tool:

When you type in the address, if a City Council member profile displays then the address is in city limits. If no City council is assigned, then the address is not eligible for SPP.





SPP has a 3-step process

- Apply
- Selection
- Enrollment

Step 1: Apply

Applying to SPP does not guarantee placement in the program. However, vacancies are filled on a rolling basis through March 31 of the program year.

Methods to apply:

Department of Education and Early Learning (DEEL) staff are available to complete the application over the phone with the parent. Language support is available upon request.

- Online:

- Parents can select as many or as few sites as they want on the application.
- ▶ The more sites selected, the greater the chance a seat will open for the child.
- Sites are not rank order however if a child gets an offer for a seat that is not the parents' top preference, they can move forward with enrollment while staying on the waitlists for all other sites they selected.
- For sites that have special programming such as Head Start and ECEAP, parents should contact the Provider directly.

Step 2: Selection

The Seattle Preschool Selection process takes into consideration various factors. Eligible preschoolers will be selected through a random selection process that utilizes the following criteria:

- * Homeless and Foster Care: Children from families experiencing homelessness and in foster care will receive priority placement.
- * Child's age: Children who are age 4 on or before August 31, 2021 will receive priority over children who are age 3.
- * Home address: If you select a site that is in the same Seattle Public Schools elementary or middle school attendance zone as your home address, you will receive priority for that site over children living in other parts of the city.
- Siblings: Additional preference is given to children with siblings either enrolled/attending SPP at the same time or attending Seattle Public Schools in the same building
- * Heritage language: Three-year-olds who speak a heritage language with a household income below 350% of the federal poverty level will receive priority over other three-year-olds.
- Low-Income: Three-year-olds with a household income below 200% of the federal poverty level will receive priority over other three-year-olds.

Waitlist

- Vacancies are filled on a rolling basis through March 31 of the program year.
- If a child is placed at a site that is not the parent's top pick, the parent may choose to enroll while keeping their child on the waitlist for all sites on their application.

Children are placed in order of the program priorities for each preschool on their application.

- Children experiencing homelessness or in foster care will be placed first
- 4-year-olds will be placed over 3-year-olds
- Children who live in the elementary or middle school zones for a preschool will get priority over students who live outside of those boundaries (To determine your neighborhood school, visit <u>Seattle Public Schools' address lookup tool</u>.)
- Three-year-olds who do not live in the attendance zone of a school will get priority if their household FPL is below 350% or they speak a heritage language.

Step 3: Enrollment

- If a seat becomes available for a child, SPP staff will reach out to parents directly via phone and email.
- Staff will discuss the placement and provide information on the next step in completing enrollment
- Enrollment can be completed online or by paper and consists of:
 - 1. Enrollment Information (Child, Household, Demographic Info and Consent)
 - 2. Proof of Child's Age
 - 3. Proof of Seattle Residency
 - 4. Proof of Income




Estimated Annual School Year Tuition⁴

Tuition

- SPP tuition is free for any family under 350% FPL (and is on a sliding scale for those above)
- SPP collects income for all families to demonstrate if parent will or will not owe tuition.
- Tuition covers the 6-hour curriculum portion of the preschool day
- For sites that offer before and after care, the cost is separate from any SPP tuition and is paid directly to Provider. All SPP Providers accept DCYF Working Connections Child Care (WCCC) subsidy, City of Seattle Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) and Private/Out of Pocket payment.

- All SPP locations are inclusive and welcome children with a range of developmental needs. We work closely in partnership with SPS Special Education Department, so children receive services wherever they are in our network.
- SPP collaborates closely with Seattle Public Schools to deliver the specialized instruction or other services required by the child's IEP.
- * To learn about resources and supports provided by Seattle Public Schools for children with IEPs enrolled at an SPP site at Seattle Public Schools, families are referred to the SPS Early Learning Department at (206) 252-0600 or email at preschool@seattleschools.org. For children with IEPs who are enrolled at a community-based organization through SPP, parents/guardians are encouraged to be in communication with their special education case manager for any modifications to, or questions about the child's IEP.
