# What is anti-blackness?

### **Anti-Blackness:**

The disregard and disgust of Black existence, culture, values, institutions, and resistance, resulting in physical, psychological, social, and economic violence against Black people. Anti-blackness describes the inability to recognize black humanity. It captures the reality that the kind of violence that saturates black life is not based on any specific thing a black person — better described as "a person who has been racialized black" — did. The violence we experience isn't tied to any particular transgression. It's gratuitous and unrelenting.

# What work does anti-blackness do?

#### The Work of Anti-Blackness As a Force of Oppression:

Creates and maintains racialized capitalist system where the goal is profit and power

Creates and maintains a gross imbalance of power resulting in disconnection and dissociation from self and others

Creates and maintains division among Black people and between folx of color

Anti-blackness covers the fact that society's hatred of blackness, and also its gratuitous violence against black people, is complicated by its need for our existence. For example, for white people — again, better described as those who have been racialized white — the abject inhumanity of the black reinforces their whiteness, their humanness, their power, and their privilege, whether they're aware of it or not. Black people are at once despised and also a useful counterpoint for others to measure their humanness against. In other words, while one may experience numerous compounding disadvantages, at least they're not black.

#### The Work of Anti-Blackness as An Anti-Racist Intervention:

Allows for specificity in understanding the scope and impact of the manifestations of systems of oppression and therefore solutions for these manifestations.

Speaks to the complexity of our experience of race and racism.

Holds the gravity of the violence experienced by Black folx and their ancestors.

Anti-blackness is one way some black scholars have articulated what it means to be marked as black in an anti-black world.
