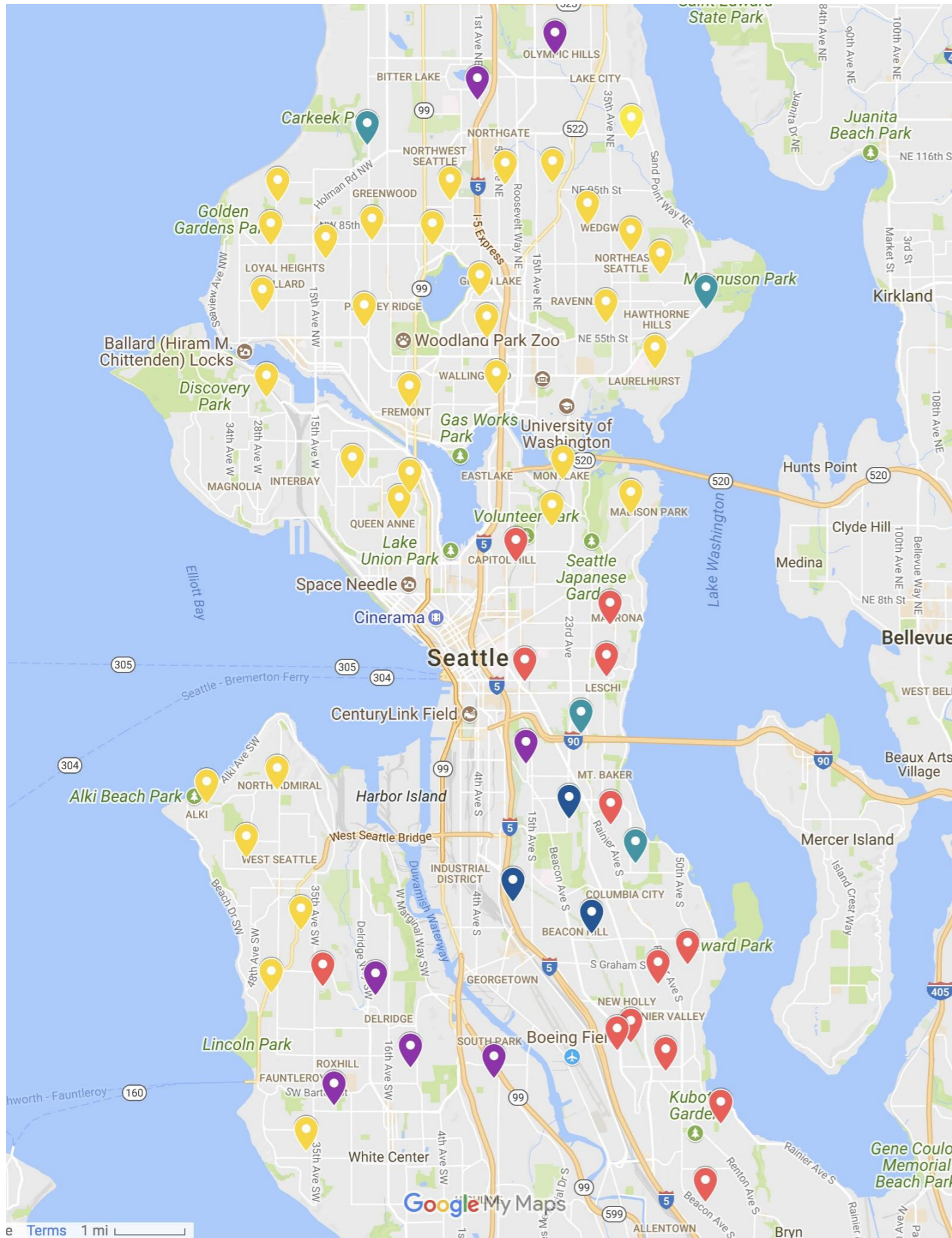

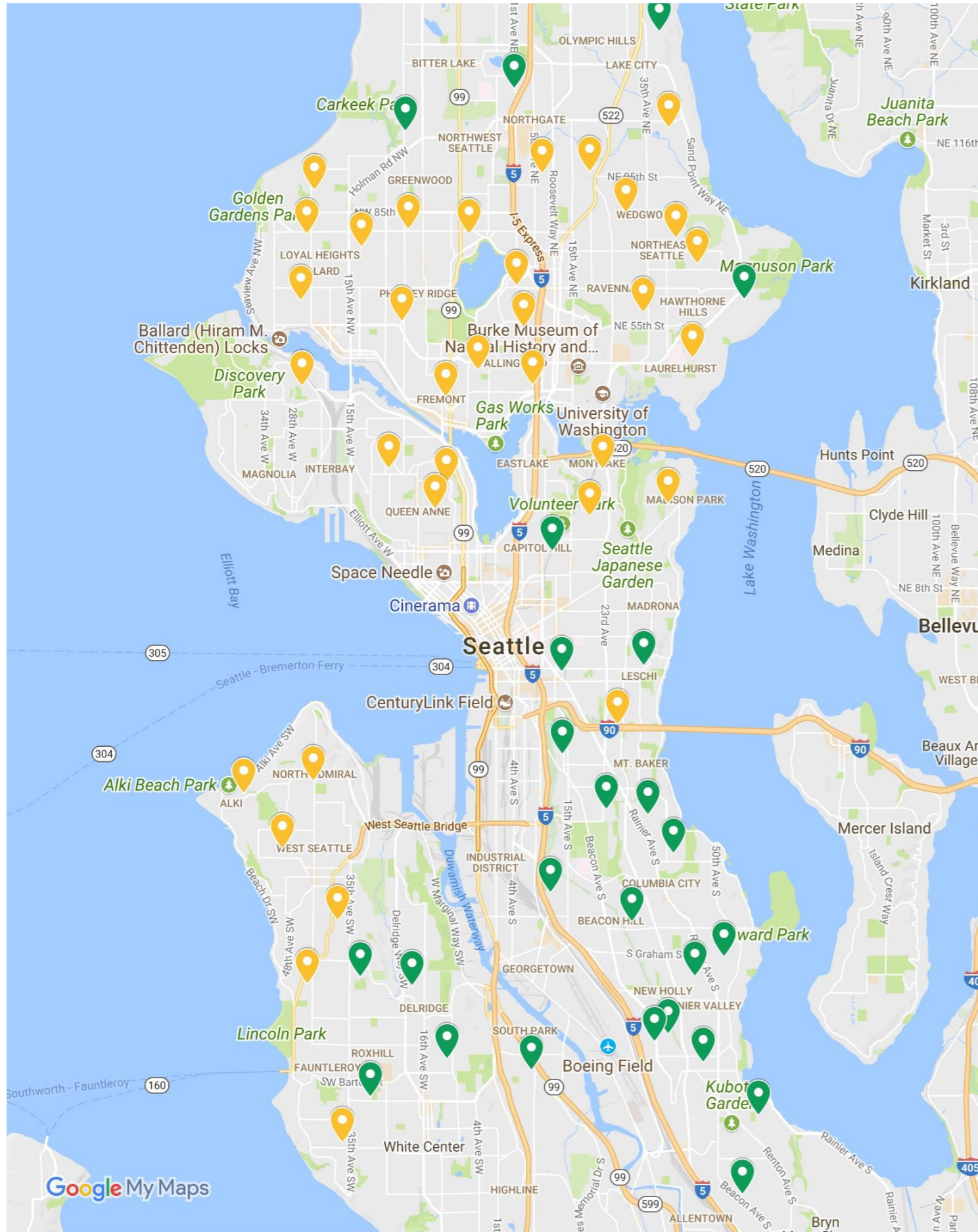

Seattle Public Schools Projected F/RL 2017-18

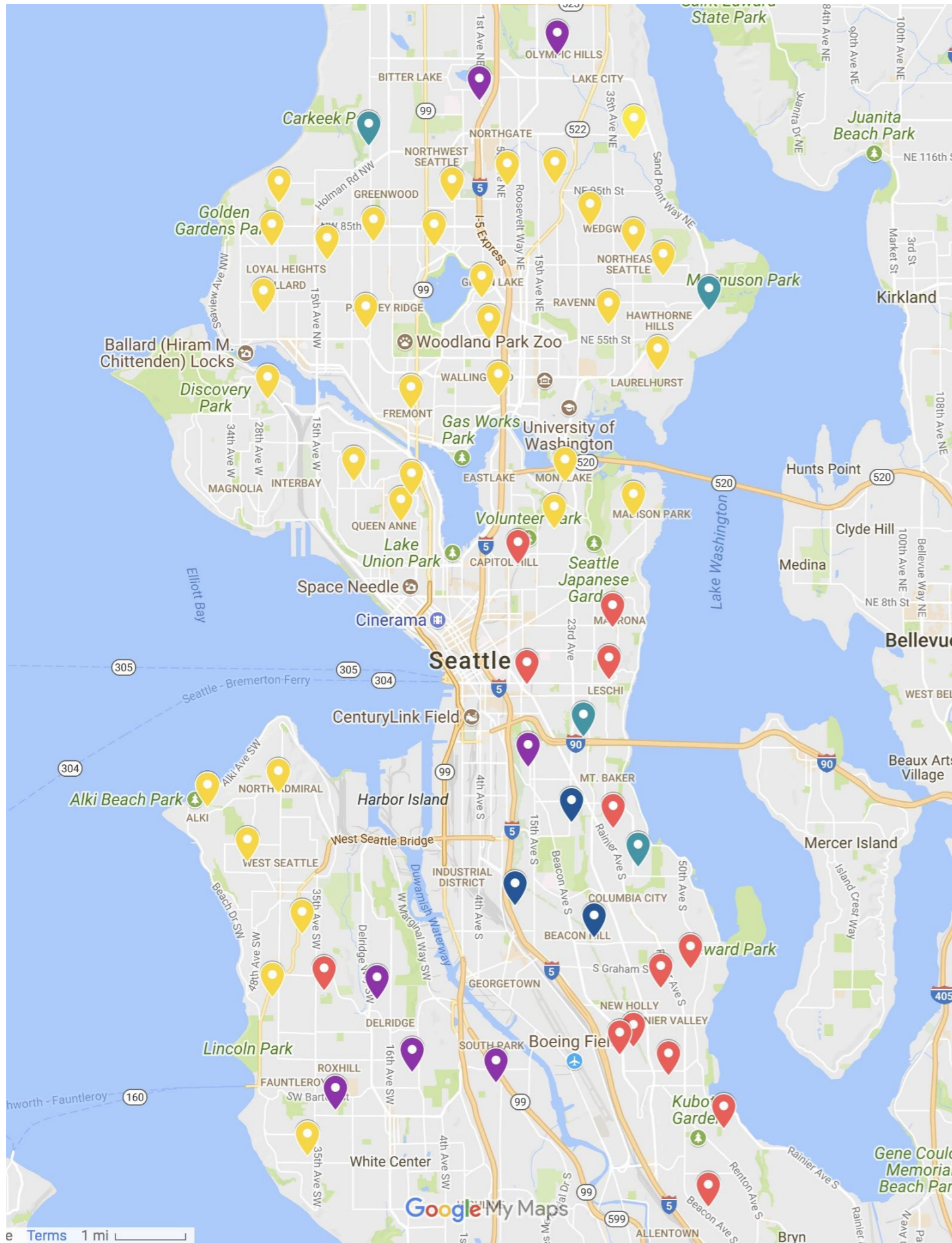

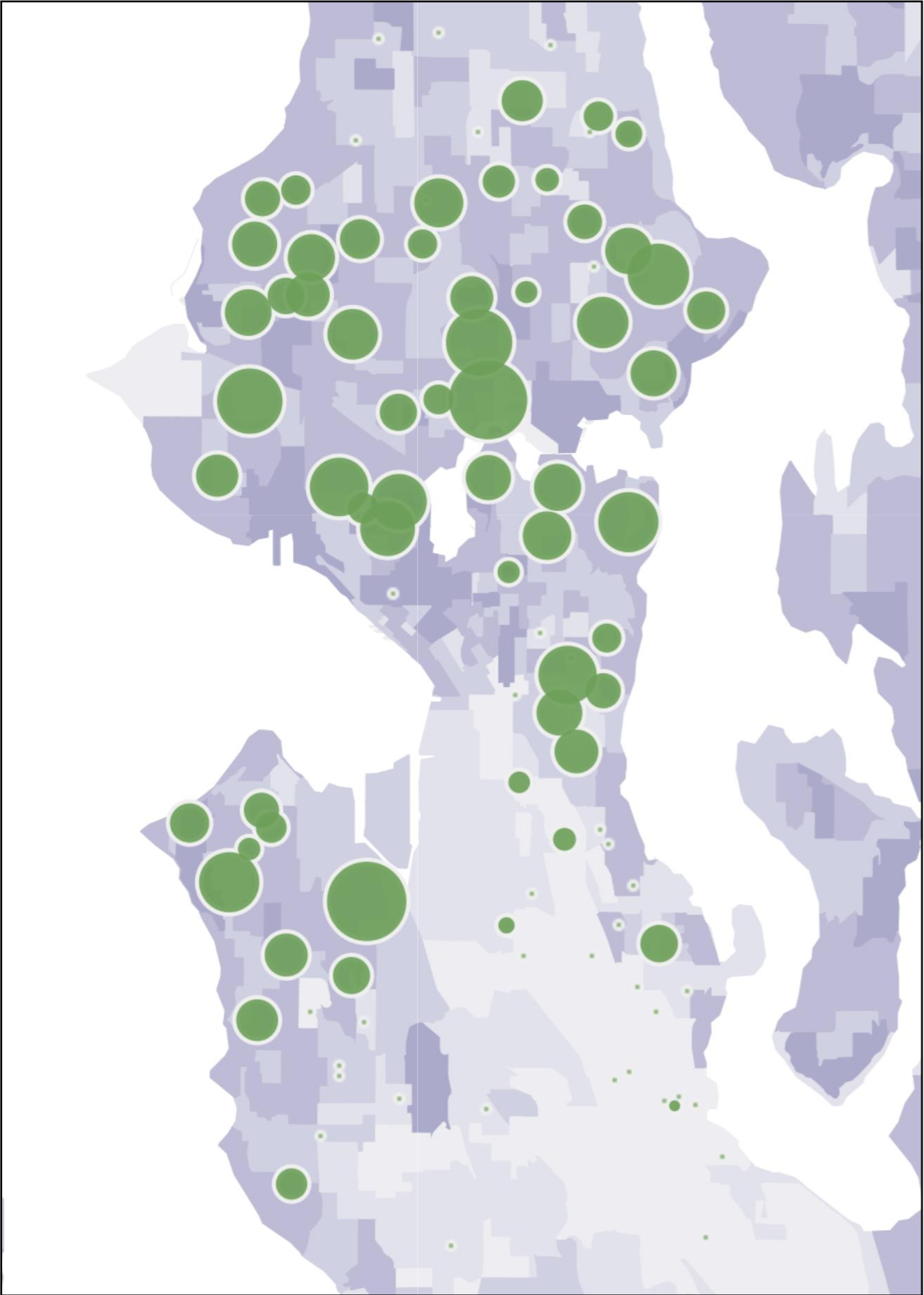
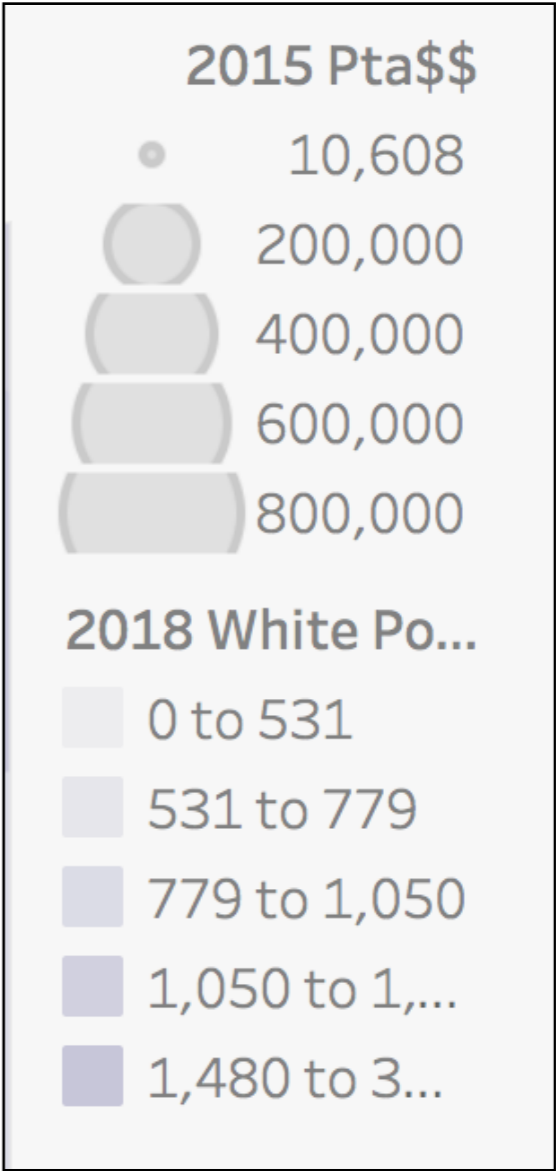

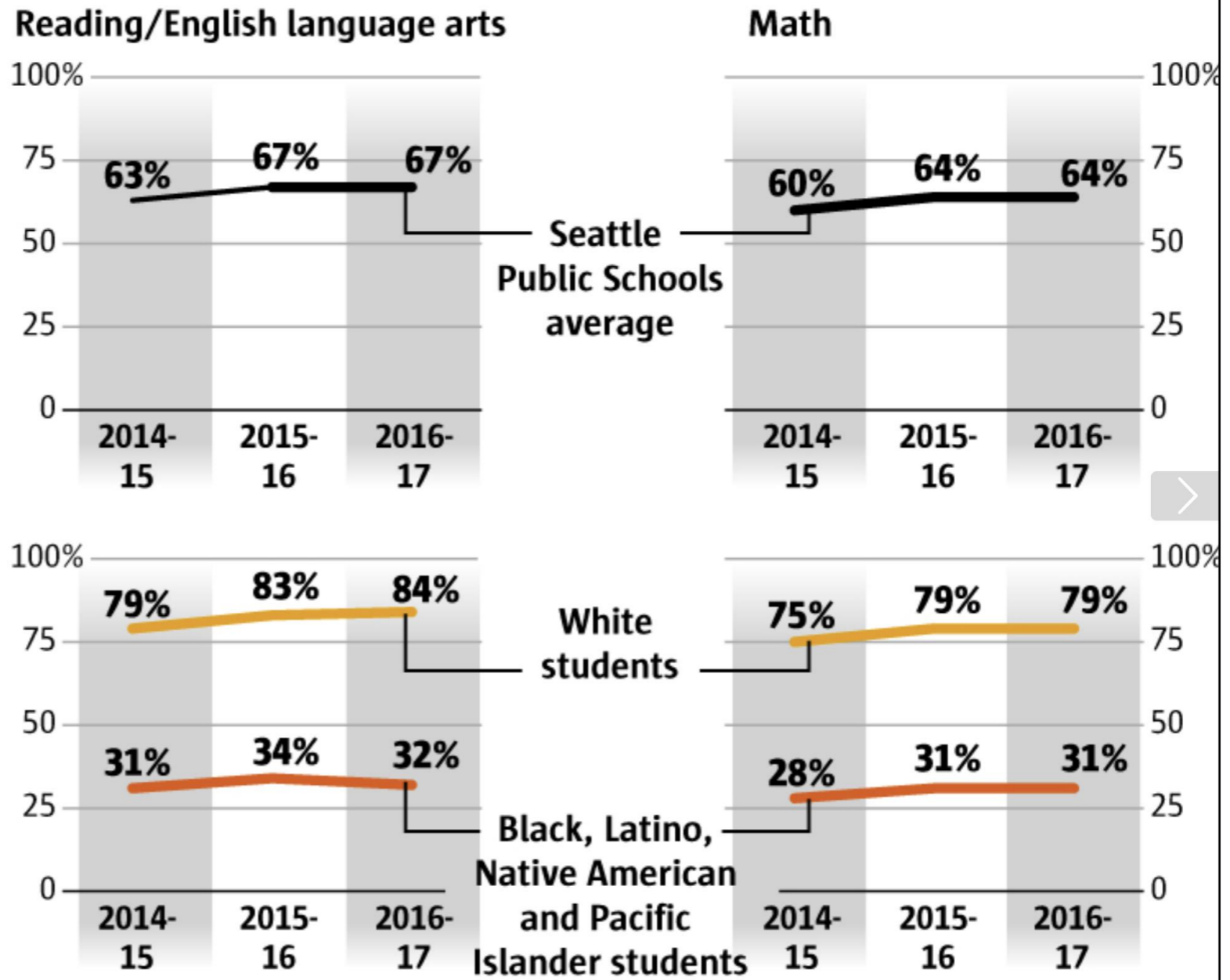
Seattle Public Schools' Racial Opportunity Gap: Big and Getting Bigger

Widening opportunity gaps

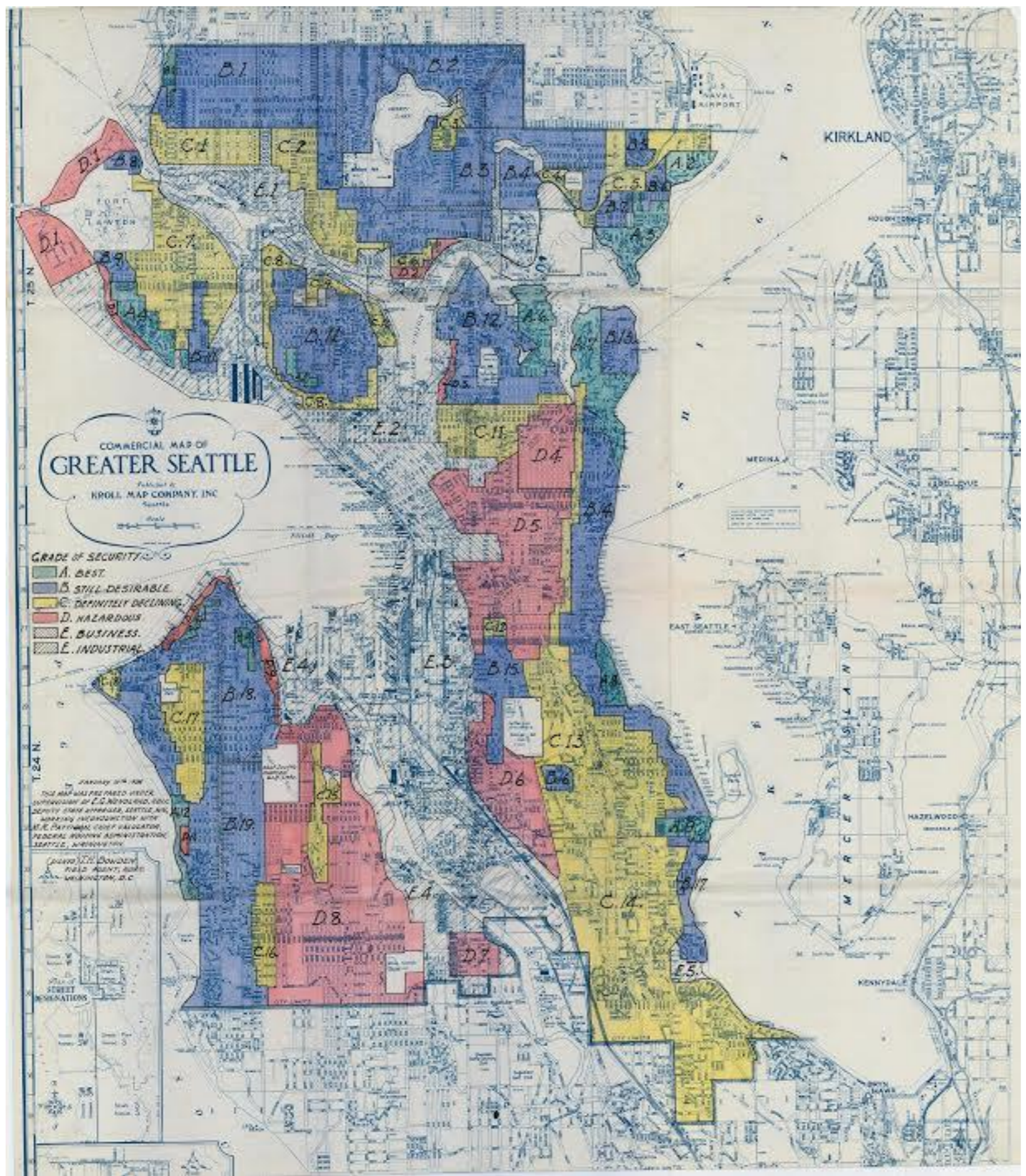
For more than seven decades, Seattle Public Schools has pledged to close the performance gap between students of color and their white peers. But the gap has not disappeared and has widened in recent years.

B. Still Desirable

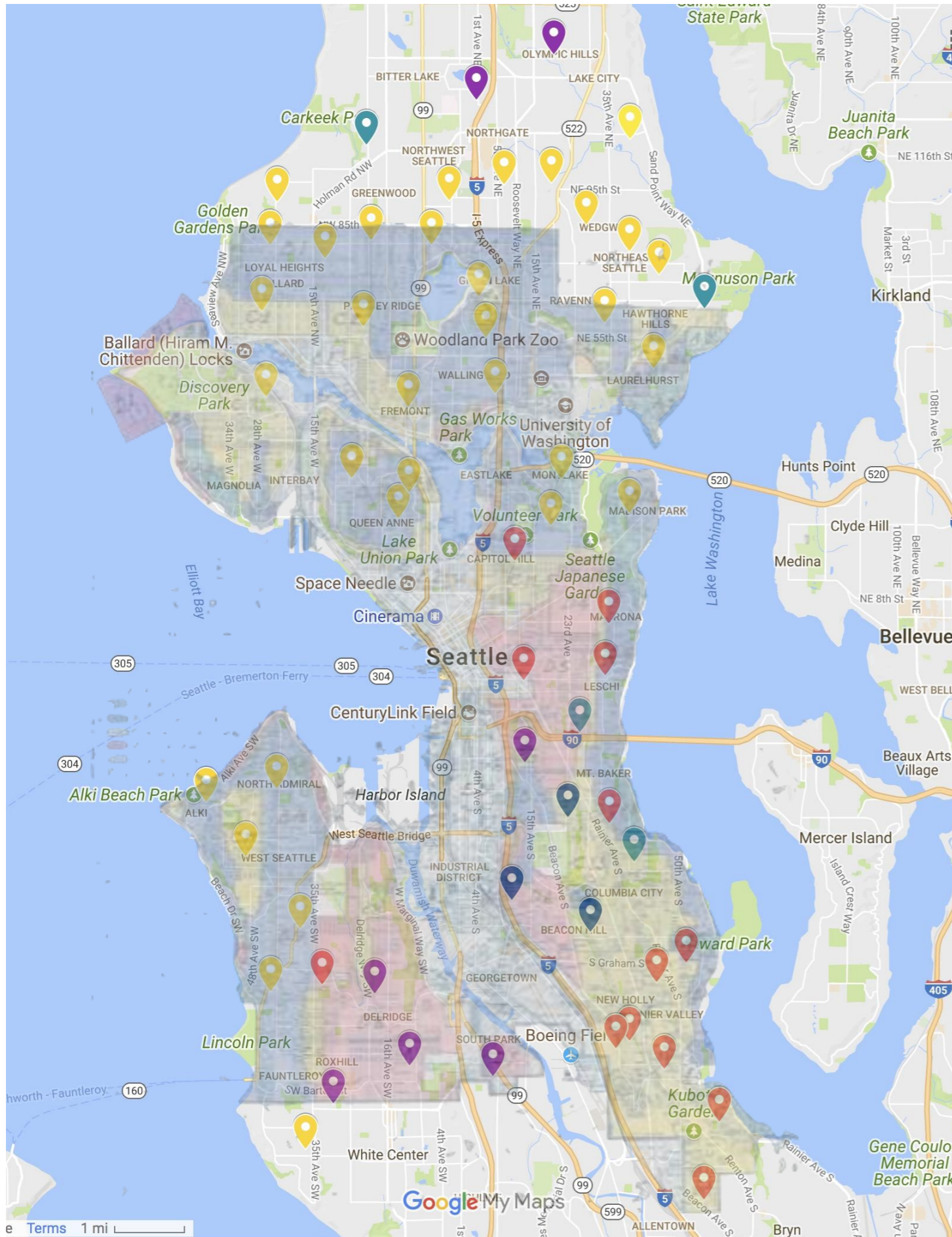
